

APPALACHIA HIGH SCHOOL SYSTEM REVIEW



BACKGROUND

The Board of Trustees has directed the staff of the Newfoundland and Labrador English School District (NLESD) to investigate the potential for the consolidation of Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High starting in 2018-19 school year.

CURRENT CONFIGURATION

The Appalachia High school system consists of Our Lady of Mercy Elementary (K-8) in St. George's, St. Michael's Elementary (K-8) in Stephenville Crossing, and Appalachia High (9-12) in St. George's.

Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High are housed in a single building connected by a hallway. Consolidation would be an organizational change only, with no change to the physical structure.

OUR LADY OF MERCY ELEMENTARY

- Our Lady of Mercy Elementary is a K-8 school with one English stream.
- School has 9 regular classrooms for 148 students.
- School received upgrades in 2000 and exterior upgrade in 2001.

APPALACHIA HIGH

- Appalachia High is a 9-12 school with one English stream.
- School has 9 regular classrooms for 115 students.
- Appalachia High School was constructed in 1984 with extension and renovations in 2000.



ENROLMENT PROJECTIONS AND ROOM REQUIREMENTS

Enrolment projections were conducted by NLESD using Baragar Systems, a custom planning software suite for use by school districts across Canada.

Room requirements are calculated on the basis of maximum class caps. For example, the class cap in primary grades is 25 students, so if there were 50 students projected in Grade 2, this means the room requirement would be listed as two rooms of 25 students per class. However, if there were 51 students projected for the next year in Grade 3, the room requirement would be listed as three rooms of 17 students per class. Combined classes of up to 18 students for grade 1 to 6 are assumed and included in room requirement calculations. Senior high classes have no official cap; these room requirement calculations assume a cap of 30. Schools with less than 25 students may use multi-grading, in which the cap on number of students depends on the grade configuration.

OUR LADY OF MERCY ELEMENTARY

Assuming its current K-8 configuration, the enrolment projections for Our Lady of Mercy Elementary are shown in Figure 1 below.

The projection model shows enrolment varying between a high of 148 in 2017 and a low of 132 in 2022. The school will require a maximum of nine classrooms in all years.

APPALACHIA HIGH

Assuming its current 9-12 configuration, the enrolment projections for Appalachia High are shown in Figure 2 below.

The projection model shows enrolment varying between a high of 138 in 2021 and a low of 112 in 2026. This enrolment trend indicates a need for a maximum of 6 classrooms.

CONSOLIDATION OF OUR LADY OF MERCY ELEMENTARY WITH APPALACHIA HIGH

Enrolment projections for the combined K-12 enrolments of Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High are shown in Figure 3 below.

The combined room count of Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High is 18. The maximum total room requirement of both schools is 15 from 2018 to 2022.

PROGRAMMING AND SERVICES

With this consolidation, there will be more opportunity for teacher collaboration across all grades. Teacher planning and collaboration provide enhanced opportunities for student learning.

CORE CURRICULUM

Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High offer the required curriculum set by the Department of Education. Appalachia High offers a range of general, academic, and advanced senior high courses and CDLI courses.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAMMING

Schools provide a variety of extra-curricular, co-curricular, and intramural activities and programs which may be available to students if consolidation of schools occurs.

STAFFING

Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High School currently have two separate administration teams with one administration unit per school. Combining the two schools would result in administration allocation of 1.25.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS IN SCHOOL

Our Lady of Mercy Elementary school has a successful Breakfast Program, supported by Kids Eat Smart and an array of volunteers including 11 parents, 5 students, and the principal. In June 2017, the school held the official opening of the Benedict Alexander Memorial Playground which is located behind the school. This was a joint partnership between the school and the Town of St. George's and provided a new \$120,000 playground to our area. The College of the North Atlantic once again partnered with the school to allow their instructor to coach the Lego Robotics Team, and to attend the World Festival in St. Louis Missouri in April.

Appalachia High School has a Breakfast and Snack Program, Recycling, Milk Day Promotions, Week without Violence, and many other yearly activities.

FACILITIES

Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High are connected by a hallway. The two schools currently share a gym and music room. Each school has an art room and a science room. Combining the schools would allow both to more effectively utilize spaces to meet programming needs.

FINANCES

Consolidating Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and Appalachia High into a single school would result in financial savings of 0.75 administration unit. This would result in a yearly saving of \$75,000. There are currently two secretarial positions — one 30-hour position and one 35-hour position. Consolidation would result in one 35-hour position. This would result in a yearly saving of approximately \$49,000. The total yearly savings would be \$124,000.
