The mission of J.M. Olds Collegiate is to enable students to reach their maximum potential through a quality learning experience and equal opportunity. In promoting a desire to learn, we believe students to be our primary focus.

The vision for J.M. Olds Collegiate is to provide a caring environment conducive to high academic achievement and community interaction directed toward a proactive approach to change.

Anecdotal conversations between staff members

Conversations with students regarding them desiring more assessment options over traditional paper and pencil methods

Student Voice survey - large number of students across all grades indicate that the current method of assessment isn't necessarily working for them Student Voice survey - the question of "how do you learn best?" received a vast variety of answers. These will be considered. Student Voice survey - majority of students (especially in high school) indicate that they prefer hands-on courses over traditional ones

- alternate assessment methods investigated and some staff taking part in SBL pilot projects for grading to be implemented in fall 2021

- Deep Learning and 6Cs launched via a weekly genius hour and also a "6Cs Tree" display in the main entrance

Next Steps:

- continue to explore alternate assessment practices for our students, particularly in the STEM courses where it may not be as easy to implement

- provide students with the autonomy to have a say in their assessment methods for a certain portion(s) of the course
- start to fill out the bulletin boards for the 6Cs as was planned, we haven't got around to this yet

- review the student voice survey data from June 2021 (done as of October 2021) and have new grade 7 students fill it out (to be completed before November 2021)

Strategic Issue: How can we bring about greater engagement for our students in all aspects of the schooling process?

How did you know this was a Strategic Issue/Objective? What evidence did you have?

- PMF 2.1 11.1% of students said physical space is slightly unpleasant
- PMF 2.1 19.7% of student did not say energy of the school was positive
- PMF 2.2 90% of staff members think students are able to help other students
- PMF 2.2 100% of staff say that colleagues are supportive in new teaching methods
- PMF 2.2 100% of teachers are trusted to teach the way they think is best
- PMF 2.3 78% of students think school staff create an environment that helps students learn
- PMF 2.3 65% of families say that classroom lessons are motivating
- PMF 2.6 43% of students feel connected to the adults in our school
- PMF 3.1 30% of students only enjoy a few of their classes
- PMF 3.1 majority of students admit to never losing track of time due to engagement
- PMF 3.1 20% of students said classes are not interesting at all
- PMF 3.1 majority of students are not eager to participate in class
- PMF 3.1 52% of students said they don't talk about ideas from classes outside of school

Student Voice survey - large number of students across all grades indicate that the current method of teaching/learning isn't necessarily working for them

Student Voice survey - large majority of students indicate they do "feel a part of the school community" but there was an underlying theme of too much focus being on our athletics program

Student Voice survey - question of "what extracurricular activities would you like to see at your school?" received a lot of answers pertaining to things we do not currently offer. Students are crying out for more options.

- weekly genius hour started at the first Friday back in September and has been running smoothly ever since

- more extracurricular activities to be implemented in the fall if COVID permits
- staff grant committee established in fall of 2021
- students provided with opportunities to paint the school via genius hour proposals
- student council established in September 2021 and continuing to search for ways to improve school spirit

new student voice survey was administered in June 2021 and responses processed and reported to staff in early October
2021

Next Steps:

- reach out to members of our community to use their expertise to run new extracurricular programs (for example, a
